West Sechelt Principal's Report: 05 Oct, 2021

1. The current student enrolment is 265. In the first week of school we moved from 11 divisions to 12 divisions. We are hoping that our 12th division will be funded by the classroom enhancement fund (C.E.F.) that will bring extra money to the school budget. There have been no staff changes. The school remains closed to cross-boundary transfers.

2. During the summer, the trees along the sidewalk on Norwest Bay Road were removed as they were deemed unsuitable due to the fact that they have large thorns that have caused first aid incidents in the past. Those trees will be replaced with maple trees in the next two months. Maples are also hoped to be planted along the front sidewalk on Mason Road.

3. An arborist was brought in over the summer to do an assessment of the 220 trees in our nature learning space adjacent to Wakefield Creek. Twenty-two trees were identified as danger trees and removed at the start of the school year. A reassessment of the space will occur every two to three years, as required.

4. Now that the watering restrictions have been removed, a contractor has been found to install sod on our field and to hydro-seed the other areas around the school.

5. Work continues to complete the fitting out of the new classrooms with technology and pull down screens, etc.

6. The FSA for grade 4 and 7 students will run this year from October 4 to November 12. One section of the FSA (the long writing assignment in the booklet) has been removed.

7. The inclusion support spaces in the school have been renovated and enlarged to include the old multipurpose room. This year we will have a 1.0 inclusion support teacher (Mr. Fremont) and a 0.6 inclusion support teacher (Ms. Lawson) in addition at a 0.3 reading support teacher (Ms. Smart).

8. The Terry Fox Run was very successful and we beat our fundraising goal, raising \$522.00: thank you, Mr. Clayton, for sponsoring the event again this year.

9. The updated K to 7 mask mandate was implemented very smoothly. The staff continues to support students who require it or who require special circumstances.

10. At the district PD day on October 22, the staff engaged in learning hosted by Kevin Lamoureux from the University of Winnipeg, supporting our work with the book, *Ensouling Our Schools*.

11. In October, our grade 4, 5, and 6 students will participate in bike safety training provided free of charge by HUB.

12. We anticipate moving our assessment proficiency scale (what replaced *letter grades*) from the current three-point scale (Concerns/Not Yet; Acquiring; Accomplished) to the new provincial 4-point scale; more information will be sent to families once the Board formally passes that resolution
